

Mt. Kannon observatory **C4 Geological**

The mountain is covered with broad-leaved trees and is known for its flowers in early spring. The observatory affords views of Samani Fishing Port, Cape Enrumu and oddly shaped rocks.



Tojuin Temple **C5 Historical**

A temple established by the Edo Shogunate around 200 years ago



In front of the radio station

Climb the hill and turn around to see spectacular views of Samani Town center and the Apoi Mountains.

Sacred Tree (daimyo oak) and 33 statues of Kannon (known as the Buddhist deity of mercy, or Avalokitesvara-bodhisattva)

Oyako-iwa rocks

A popular summertime destination for beachgoers and campers

Numerous fishing boats anchor here at certain times of day. Pass Sobira-iwa rock and continue ahead.

Cape Enrumu **C3 Geological**

The land-tied island here creates a favorable natural harbor. Cape affords sweeping views of Samani Town.



Samani Folk Museum
This small folk museum at the birthplace of Samani holds old documents from Tojuin Temple that have been collectively designated as a National Important Cultural Property.

Mt. Apoi Peridotite Plaza



This plaza showcases polished specimens of peridotite and other rocks from the Hidaka Mountains. They are used for practical training by university students among other purposes.



Samani Station
Start out toward Mt. Apoi from in front of Samani Station. The station building houses a tourist information center.
